Personal Protection Equipment (PPE)

The Board has been working with the Emergency Management Office and the Department of Health and Wellness in identifying PPE supply requirements for funeral homes. We have provided a list of supplies that could be required by funeral homes during this pandemic.

Weekly Updates

The Chairman and Executive Manager regularly participate on a weekly teleconference of National Funeral Professionals every Thursday afternoon, so we can continue to be updated from all jurisdictions across the nation on the latest news and information on the Covid-19 pandemic.

Essential Services Designation

The funeral sector has been recognized and designated by the federal government as an essential service. Provincially we have been included in the on-line tool launched by the NS Government to determine essential services. The Death Care Sector has been included in the Health division.



Communications with Nova Scotia's Chief Medical Officer
